APPENDIX "A" FEE SCHEDULE

ARTICLE 1.000 GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 1.100 Fess required

All persons, firms or corporations applying for licenses, inspections, permits or other City services, activities, or uses that require the applicant to pay a fee, shall pay the fees prescribed by this article.

Sec. 1.200 City Council Authority

(a) Periodic review. The City Council shall periodically review the need for and the amount of fees for City services, uses, and activities and shall adopt or revise fees as the City Council determines is appropriate.

(b) Additional fees. In addition to the fees established in this fee schedule, the City Council may adopt other ordinances from time to time establishing various fees for other City service, activities and uses.

Sec. 1.300 Violation; Penalty

(a) Violation. A person commits an offense if the person conducts an activity or commences a use for which the payment of a fee is required if the person has not paid the fee.

(b) Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation who commits an offense under subsection (a) shall be fined in accordance with the general penalty provision in section 1.01.009 of this code.

ARTICLE 2.000 WATER SERVICE FEES

Sec. 2.100 Deposits and reconnection fees

Before water service may be initiated at a location, the customer must pay the following fees:

(1) Deposits. A utility deposit shall be paid in accordance with article 5.000 of this fee schedule.

(2) Disconnect list fees.

(A) Residential: \$25.00.

(B) Commercial: \$25.00.

(C) Disconnect fee, if reconnected by anyone other than a city employee:
\$25.00.

(3) Reconnection. Reconnection made after normal hours: \$50.00.

Sec. 2.400 Water tapping fees

- (a) Residential. The fee for a residential water tap is \$450.00 plus actual cost of materials and installation related to the tap.
- (b) Nonresidential. The fees for nonresidential water taps are as follows plus actual cost of materials and installation related to the tap:

ARTICLE 3.000 SEWER SERVICE FEES

Sec. 3.100 Deposit

A utility deposit shall be paid in accordance with Article 5.000 of this fee schedule.

Sec. 3.200 Residential sewer

For residential sewer service, the monthly rates are as follows:

- (1) For service within the City limits:

The volume charge shall be based on the gallons of water used, determined by an average monthly consumption figure. Average monthly consumption figures for each user will be determined annually using the average actual water consumption during the months of December, January and February for use during the next calendar year.

Sec. 3.300 Commercial and industrial sewer

(a) The monthly rate for commercial and industrial sewer service is \$4.00 per 1,000 gallons of water used plus a monthly base rate for commercial and industrial sewer service determined by meter size for customers with: (1) separate dedicated water meters for irrigation purposes; or (2) with water meter in excess of 3/4 inch, as follows:

(b) The monthly rate for commercial and industrial sewer service for customers: (1) not having separate dedicated water meters for irrigation purposes; and (2) having 3/4 inch water meters, is \$20.00 per month plus \$4.00 per 1,000 gallons of water used.

Sec. 3.400 Additional surcharge

Any industrial pre-treatment sewer customers shall pay an additional monthly surcharge of \$0.090 per pound of biological oxygen demand (BOD) plus \$0.057 per pound of total suspended solids (TSS) as measured at the source.

Sec. 3.500 Sewer tapping fees

- (a) Residential. The fee for a residential sewer tap is \$275.00.
- (b) Nonresidential. The fee for a nonresidential sewer tap is \$275.00 plus actual costs of materials and installation related to the tap.

ARTICLE 4.000 TRASH COLLECTION

Sec. 4.100 Deposit

A utility deposit shall be paid in accordance with Article 5.000 of this fee schedule.

Sec. 4.200 Residential

The monthly fee for one time per week residential curb-side trash collection and recycling is \$14.11; this includes one vendor-provided semi-automated cart per residence. Additional carts are available for \$3.82 per cart per month for those residents who opt for this service.

Sec. 4.300 Commercial

Commercial service accounts will be billed by the City's franchise contractor to the customer in the amounts as specified in the City's franchise agreement.

ARTICLE 5.000 UTILITY DEPOSITS

Before water, sewer or trash collection service may be initiated at a location the customer must pay the following utility deposit:

- (1) Water and/or sewer service.
 - (A) Residential (within or outside city limits): \$85.00.
 - (B) Commercial/industrial (within or outside the city limits): \$200.00.
 - (C) Use of bulk water meter: \$1,080.00.
 - (D) Water from bulk meter: \$720.00.

- (2) Trash collection.
 - (A) Residential: \$85.00.
 - (B) Commercial service accounts will be billed by the City's franchise contractor to the customer in the amounts as specified in the City's franchise agreement.

 - (C) A customer who receives water and/or sewer service and has paid a utility deposit in connection with such service is not required to pay an additional utility deposit for trash collection service at the same location.

ARTICLE 6.000 ADMINISTRATIVE FEES

- (a) Office and copy fees.
 - (1) Notary fees: \$3.00 per notary signature.

- (2) Certified open records certificate: \$5.00 per certificate.
- (3) Returned check (NSF): \$25.00.

The charge for copies will mean per page or part of a page. Each side that has recorded information is considered a page.

- (4) Copies for open records (per page):
 - (A) Standard size: \$0.10.
 - (B) Oversized (11 x 17): \$0.25.
- (5) Copier charges:
 - (A) Per standard page side: \$0.10.
 - (B) Oversized (11 x 17) page side: \$0.25.
- (6) Black and white printing: \$0.10 per page.
- (7) Color copies and printing: \$0.25 per page.
- (8) Send/receive faxes: \$1.00 per page (not color faxes).
- (9) Rewritable CD (CD-RW) \$1.00
- (10) Non-rewritable CD (CD-R) \$1.00
- (11) Digital Video Disc (DVD) \$3.00
- (12) USB drive Actual cost
- (13) Other electronic media Actual cost
- (14) VHS video cassette \$2.50
- (15) Specialty paper (e.g.: Mylar, blueprint, blueline, map, photographic – Actual cost.
- (16) Labor charge for programming. If a particular request requires the services of a programmer in order to execute an existing program or to create a new program so that requested information may be accessed and copied, the governmental body may charge for the programmer's time.
- (17) If the charge for providing a copy of public information includes costs of labor, a governmental body shall comply with the requirements of §552.261(b) of the Texas Government Code.
- (18) Labor charge for locating, compiling, manipulating data, and reproducing public information.

- (19) The charge for labor costs incurred in processing a request for public information is \$15 an hour. The labor charge includes the actual time to locate, compile, manipulate data, and reproduce the requested information.

A labor charge shall not be billed in connection with complying with requests that are for 50 or fewer pages of paper records, unless the documents to be copied are located in:

- (A) Two or more separate buildings that are not physically connected with each other; or
- (B) A remote storage facility.

The City may charge any fees that are necessary to recover the costs for providing the public information requests that are allowed by the Texas Administrative Code; Title 1 Administration; Part 3 Office of the Attorney General; Chapter 70 Cost of Copies of Public Information; Rule § 70.3 Charges for Providing Copies of Public Information.

(b) Mowing and/or cleaning property.

- (1) City crew: \$75.00 (admin fees).
 - (A) Tractor/mower with operator: \$75.00/hr.
 - (B) Loader with operator: \$75.00/hr.
 - (C) Dumptruck with operator: \$75.00/hr.
 - (D) Hand mower with operator: \$75.00/hr.
 - (E) Extra personnel: \$20.00/hr.
- (2) Contractor: Actual costs (plus \$75.00 admin fees).

(c) Animal impoundment fees.

- (1) Daily boarding fees (kenneling):
 - (A) Dog, cat, or small animal: \$30.00 per day.
 - (B) Other than dog, cat or small animal: \$30.00 per day.
- (2) Service calls and rabies response (excluding head preparation and shipment): \$43.00 per hour for staff time.
- (3) Head preparation and shipment: \$50.00 per animal head.
- (4) Educational services: \$43.00 per hour staff time.

- (5) Euthanization and disposal: \$12.00 per animal.
- (6) Emergency animal control response: \$50.00 per hour staff time.
- (7) Fees to be paid by animal owners for reclaimed animals:
 - (A) Rabies vaccination fee: \$9.00 per reclaimed dog or cat.
 - (B) Daily boarding fees (kenneling):
 - (i) Dog, cat, or small animal: \$30.00 per day.
 - (ii) Other than a dog, cat or small animal: \$30.00 per day.
- (8) Trap rental: \$30.00 per trap per week.
- (9) Trap emptying: \$25.00 per visit.
- (10) Wildlife removal: \$0–\$30.00 depending upon situation.

(d) Annual trade registration fees. Anyone desiring to do work, for which a construction permit is required, is to register with the city as a contractor. This requirement does not apply to a homeowner doing work on a single-family residence which is declared as the owner's homestead. Renewal constitutes no lapse in registration.

- (1) Master electrician: New (\$50.00); renewal (\$25.00).
- (2) Mechanical: New (\$50.00); renewal (\$25.00).
- (3) Irrigator: New (\$50.00); renewal (\$25.00).

(e) Rental of City facilities.

- (1) Community center rentals:
 - (A) City council, committee or commission meetings, including city-sponsored events at any time (city public library events, city VFD, elections, etc.): Fee: \$0.00; deposit: \$0.00.

(i) Any renter, with the exception of the city’s senior citizens/Meals on Wheels (owners of the kitchen equipment), that desires use of the kitchen facilities to serve food, which includes any operation of equipment (i.e., refrigerator, microwave, oven, range, dishwasher, coffee pot, tea maker, can opener, etc.).

(ii) Fees must be paid by cash, check, credit card or money order at the time of registration. Please make checks payable to the “City of Haslet.” Returned checks will be subject to the NSF charge as listed in this fee schedule. All returned checks and fees must be made in cash.

(f) Environmental Collection.

- (1) Hazardous Materials --The City of Haslet has a contract with the City of Fort Worth to allow residents of Haslet to bring their hazardous materials to one of Fort Worth’s collection sites. The cost for each trip is \$47.00. The fee is subject to change. A voucher must be obtained at the Haslet City Hall prior to dumping.
- (2) Brush --Residents can obtain a voucher at the Haslet City Hall to dump brush and certain burnable debris on days other than the scheduled dumping days. The cost is \$25.00 per load per day for the first load and \$50.00 for two or more loads on the same day. No loads can take longer than 2 hours to dump.

ARTICLE 7.000 DEVELOPMENT FEES

(a) Annexations.

- (1) Less than 75 acres: \$1,000.00.

(2) 75 acres or more: \$1,000.00 + \$4.00/acre over 75.

(b) Zoning.

(1) Change or amendment:

(A) 0–5 acres: \$1,000.00.

(B) More than 5 acres: \$1,500.00.

(C) Special zoning hearing by city council: \$500.00.

(2) Special exception: \$500.00 min* All expenses including legal, engineering or surveying fees and city staff manpower expended will require full reimbursement by applicant.

(3) Change in the master thoroughfare plan: \$500.00.

(4) Variance to zoning ordinance: \$100.00.

(5) Special use permit: \$100.00 - Applicant shall pay all legal and engineering fees incurred by the city in connection with the processing of the application.

(6) Specific use permit - other than wind energy systems, petroleum or gas wells or pipelines or common carrier pipelines: \$1,000.00.

(7) Specific use permit for petroleum or gas wells, or petroleum or gas pipelines other than common carrier pipelines and related fees**:

(A) Specific use permit for new petroleum or gas well: \$5,000.00.

(B) Specific use permit for new petroleum or gas pipeline other than common carrier pipelines: \$3,000.00 plus ten cents per running foot.

(C) Transfer of permit if well is sold: \$150.00.

(D) Acceptance inspection of completed by gas inspector and fire department: \$200.00.

(E) Petroleum and gas inspector's periodic inspection: \$1,000.00.

(F) Reinspection fee, if required: \$1,000.00.

(G) Fire department inspection (periodic but not more often than every 30 days if no defect or violation is found): \$50.00.

(8) Specific use permit for wind energy systems and related fees**:

- (A) Professional fee escrow deposit: \$1,000.00.
 - (B) S.U.P. fee is based on the value of work per subsection (i)(1) of this article.
- (9) Planned development site plan: \$650.00.
 - (10) Continuances: \$200.00 - Continuances of board of adjustment, planning and zoning commission hearings by request of the applicant after public notice.

**The applicant is responsible for payment of all legal and engineering fees incurred by the City in connection with the processing of the application.

(c) Platting.

- (1) Preliminary plat*:
 - (A) Residential:
 - (i) Less than 3 lots: \$1,000.00.
 - (ii) 3 lots or more: \$1,000.00 + \$10.00 per lot.
 - (B) Commercial or industrial: \$1,000.00 + \$90.00 per acre.
 - (C) Additional review, after original review and one minor correction: \$500.00 for each additional.
- (2) Final plat*:
 - (A) Residential:
 - (i) Less than 3 lots: \$1,000.00.
 - (ii) 3 lots or more: \$1,000.00 + \$10.00 per lot.
 - (B) Commercial or industrial: \$1,000.00 + \$90.00 per acre.
 - (C) Additional review, after original review and one minor correction: \$500.00 for each additional.
- (3) Replat*:
 - (A) Residential:
 - (i) Less than 3 lots: \$1,000.00.

- (ii) 3 lots or more: \$1,000.00 + \$10.00 per lot.
- (B) Commercial or industrial: \$1,000.00 + \$90.00 per acre.
- (C) Additional review, after original review and one minor correction: \$500.00 for each additional.
- (4) Plat vacation*: \$300.00.

*The applicant is also responsible for the payment of the engineering and legal fees incurred by the City in the review and processing of the plat application, community facilities agreement and/or other development agreement that may be deemed necessary.

(d) Miscellaneous development fees.

- (1) Subdivision infrastructure plans review: 1% of total construction cost for water, sanitary sewer, paving and storm drains.
- (2) Infrastructure construction inspection fee: 3% of total construction cost for water, sanitary sewer, paving and storm drains.
- (3) Floodway fringe development permit: \$250.00.
- (4) Floodplain development permit review: \$250.00–\$2,000.00 (actual cost of administration, review and processing of the application).
- (5) Street name change: \$500.00.
- (6) Easement vacation: \$300.00**.
- (7) Street and right-of-way vacations: \$500.00**.
- (8) Connection fee to westside sanitary sewer for development of property in the westside sanitary sewer service area: \$392.54 acre.
- (9) Subsurface drilling permit: \$1,500.00.
- (10) Common carrier pipeline permit: \$750.00.
- (11) Variance request to City Ordinances other than zoning cases: \$100.00.

** The applicant is also responsible for payment of legal and engineering fees incurred by the city in connection with the processing of the application.

(e) Park fund land and improvement fees.

- (1) Residential developments per dwelling unit: \$500.00 per dwelling unit.
- (2) Nonresidential developments: \$1,000.00 per every 10,000 square feet of building area of the initial building permit.

(f) Signs.

- (1) Master Sign Plan \$200.00
- (2) Sign permit \$85.00
- (3) Sign Panel Replacement \$15.00 per sign
- (4) Window Sign \$10.00 for 0-4 sq. ft, then \$2.50 per sq ft over or fraction thereof.
- (5) Sign storage \$10.00 per day

(g) Permits for vendors, peddlers, commercial solicitors or itinerant merchants.

- (1) Thirty day permit \$25.00 per vending unit
- (2) Six month permit \$50.00 per vending unit
- (3) Six month renewal permit \$25.00 per vending unit

In addition, at the time of the application, all new and annual renewal applicants shall pay to the City the reasonable cost of performing a criminal history background investigation on that applicant and all their employees that will work within the City.

(h) Miscellaneous permits.

- (1) Application fee for license in right-of-way: \$350.00 plus payment of engineering and legal fees incurred by the city in connection with the processing of the application.
- (2) Boring and cutting on roadways: \$100.00.
- (3) Excavations in rights-of-way: \$1,000.00 (except franchised utilities).
- (4) Swimming pool permit:
 - (A) In-ground pool: Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
 - (B) Changes to existing in-ground pool: \$50.00.

- (C) Aboveground pool: \$50.00.
- (D) Changes to existing aboveground pool: \$25.00.
- (5) Water well drilling permit: \$75.00 irrigation use only.
- (6) Carports: Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
- (7) Additions and alterations: Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
- (8) Patios, patio covers, patio enclosures, decks, porches and porch enclosures: Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
- (9) Portable building (greater than 120 square feet): Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
- (10) Accessory building (greater than 120 square feet): Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
- (11) Demolition: \$25.00.
- (12) Underground storage tank: \$50.00 (includes gas lines to tank).
- (13) Fence (over 6 feet in height): \$50.00.
- (14) Lawn irrigation system: Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
- (15) Propane tank: \$50.00.
- (16) Reroofing: Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).
- (17) Parking lots: Based on value of work per subsection (i)(1).

(i) Building permit fees.

ARTICLE 11.000 LIBRARY

Sec. 11.100 Library fines

(a) Overdue fines.

(1) Overdue fines will be \$0.25 per day per item for all items. The maximum overdue fine per item will be \$5.00 or the value of the item, whichever is less. Fines are subject to change at any time.

(2) If patron library fines are \$5.00 or more, borrowing privileges will be suspended. Once all fines have been paid and/or materials have been returned, borrowing privileges will be reinstated.

(b) Lost or damaged items. Rates for lost or irreparable items are the current market costs. Rates vary for items which the current cost is unavailable.

(c) Interlibrary loans. Patrons will be required to pay \$3.00 return postage fee for each item requested plus any additional fees required by the lending library.
