CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS MOVING FORWARD

It is hard not to notice that there are several commercial construction projects going on near Avondale-Haslet Road and FM 156.

In LeTara Village, a Sonic Restaurant is being built. The company projects that the location will be open to the public within the next month. The building being constructed just north of the same intersection on the east side of the

road is a 10,000 square foot medical/professional office building. The office spaces are for lease and depending on occupancy success, the site may add two similar buildings. On Schoolhouse Road, a 4,000 square foot professional office building is under construction. One tenant known in this building will be an insurance company.

Residential construction starts are up as well. There are eleven new homes currently underway with The Meadow Phase 2B leading in the number of active residential projects. We look forward to welcoming these new businesses and neighbors to our City.

Rate Increase from Allied Effective August 1, 2014, there was a 1.04% rate increase by Allied Waste. For residential pickup & recycling curbside the increase is \$0.11—from \$14.11 to \$14.22 per month; residential trash carts increase is \$0.04—from \$3.82 to \$3.86 per month. The increase will appear in your bill this month.
