GENERAL ELECTION TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6TH OVERVIEW OF BALLOT ITEMS/WHERE TO VOTE

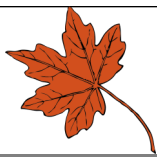
On Election Day, Tuesday, November 6th, there are many important National, State and County positions on the ballot for your consideration as well as Tarrant County Hospital District (TCHD) Proposition A. Offices include US Senator and 6 US Representatives; Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Comptroller of Public Accounts, Commissioners of the General Land Office and of Agriculture, Railroad Commissioner; State Senators and Representatives; District Clerk, County Clerk, Tax Assessor-Collector, County Commissioners, Judges at all levels and Justices of the Peace. In addition, the proposed TCHD Proposition A is to consider the issuance of \$800,000,000 in bonds by Tarrant County on behalf of the Tarrant County Hospital District for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, improving, equipping or enlarging facilities of the hospital system, including, but not limited to, a new mental health and behavioral health hospital, a new main hospital tower for general and specialized patient care-physician nurse training- and Level One Trauma Care, a new cancer center, four new regional health centers, and a new ambulatory surgical center. If approved, this bond will be a zero-tax rate increase.

Early voting is Monday October 22nd to Friday November 2nd. Precincts 3043, 3152 and 3185 will vote at the Haslet Community Center, 105 Main St., Haslet. Precincts 3192, 3363 and 3567 will vote at the Heritage Baptist Church, 1200 FM 156 South, Haslet. Early Voting will not be held at either of these locations with the closest early voting location to Haslet being at the Villages of Woodland Springs Amenity Center, 12209 Timberland Blvd, Fort Worth, 76244. HASLET CITY HALL & COURT PARKING CHANGES

Parking Spaces at Haslet City Hall fronting FM 156 have been closed permanently due to the impending construction of the Schoolhouse Road Shared Use Path and Texas Department of Transportation future plans to widen FM 156. The Schoolhouse Road Shared Use Path will provide walking connectivity all the way from Haslet Elementary School through Haslet Community Park and Gammill Park to the northern edge of Old Town and requires part of the right-of-way in front of City Hall that has been used as parking. In order to replace parking spaces that have been lost, recently City Council approved & completed the purchase of 109 Main Street, formerly WEF Electronics. The property is located next door to the Haslet Community Center. City Council also approved and allocated funds to build additional parking on the newly acquired property. The project is now in the planning stages and targeted for completion during FY 2019.
