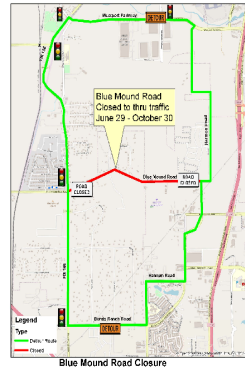

BLUE MOUND ROAD CLOSED TO THRU TRAFFIC 6/29 TO 10/30



Due to road improvement construction, Blue Mound Road will be closed to thru traffic beginning June 29th thru October 30th. This construction will be rebuilding the road to a two-lane concrete section in front of the Watercress and Regal Ridge Subdivision and the dangerous hairpin turn is being smoothed into a safer arc. During construction Blue Mound will remain open only for local two-way traffic up to the western entrance of Maxwell Road. Eastbound Blue Mound will be closed from Maxwell Road to Harmon Road. Westbound traffic will remain open to local traffic only. COMPLETE THE 2020 CENSUS

Filling out the census ensures Haslet gets its fair share of federal funding for healthcare, public schools, job training, emergency services and more during the next 10 years. It also helps Texas receive accurate representation in the U.S. House of Representatives. Don't let our city or state be underrepresented! So, if you haven't already responded to the 2020 Census by mail, phone or online, the process is easier than ever. For residents who don't have internet access, the Haslet Public Library has internet computers available for public use at no charge. The census takes just 10 minutes to complete. It will ask you how many people live with you and if you own or rent your house. It will also ask your name, sex, age, birthday, ethnicity and race. The information you provide will remain confidential. The Census Bureau is required by federal law to protect your information. They can only use your information for statistical purposes. Everyone has the right to participate. Despite what you may have heard, the census will not ask about your or your family's citizenship or immigration status. You don't have to be a citizen; the census counts everyone living in the United States. Starting in August 2020, census takers will begin visiting homes that haven't responded to the census to ensure everyone is counted. The best way to avoid a follow-up visit from a census taker is to fill out the 2020 Census questionnaire as soon as you receive an invitation to participate. If someone visits your home to collect information for the 2020 Census, you can check to make sure that they have a government issued ID badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark and an expiration date. If you still have questions about their identity, contact the Dallas Regional Census Center at 972-510-1800 to speak with a Census Bureau representative. Census workers are not required to have a solicitors permit from the city. From your internet browser go to 2020census.gov to begin taking the census. It's not too late to be counted so please if you haven't taken the census yet please do so.

ANNUAL CLEAN UP EVENT SET FOR SATURDAY, JULY 11TH

The 2020 Residential Spring Cleanup Day has finally been rescheduled to take place on Saturday, July 11th from 8 am to 12 Noon behind the Haslet Fire Station. The drop-off is free for Haslet residents. You must show two forms of identification— please bring a copy of your water bill and your driver's license. Accepted items include residential quantities of brush and yard waste, furniture, lumber, old fences, mattresses, scrap metal, automobile batteries. Demo waste and waste from commercial or home-based contractors will not be accepted. Onsite shredding services for paper documents, paper products and cardboard will also be onsite at the event. This year household hazardous waste and electronics recycling will not be onsite. These items can be disposed of through the Porch Pickup Program. FIREWORKS ARE PROHIBITED IN THE CITY OF HASLET

Just a reminder that the City of Haslet does not allow the discharge, use, sale, ignition, manufacture or storage of fireworks which includes firecrackers, cannon crackers, sky rockets, torpedoes, roman candles, sparklers, squibs, fire balloons, or any other substance intended for a visible or audible pyrotechnic display. Any fireworks found will be confiscated without compensation. Violation is also punishable by fine (City of Haslet Ordinance 0705-03). More info is available at www.Haslet.org.
